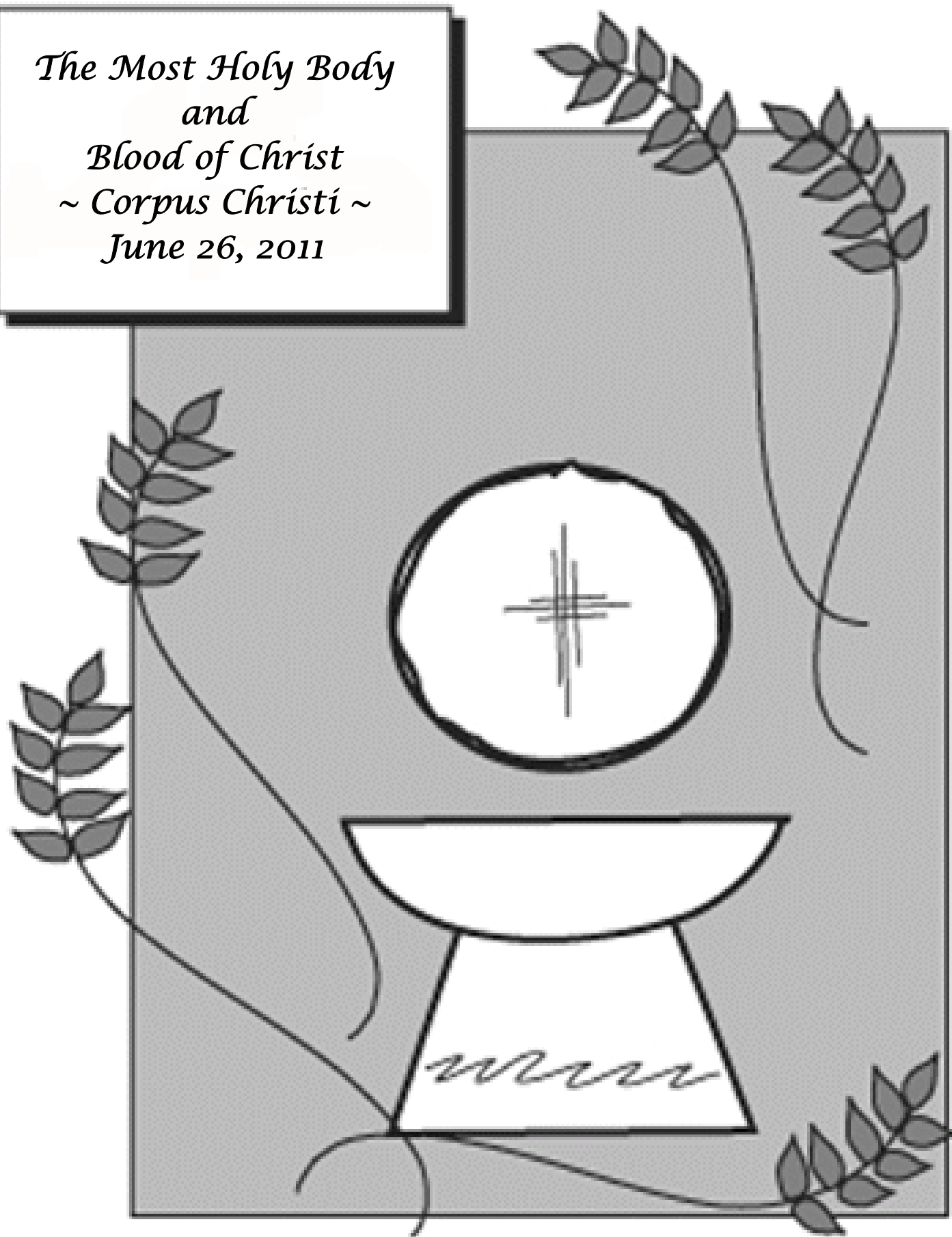
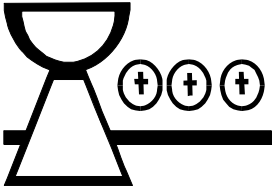

PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Parishioners,

In the creation stories in the Book of Genesis, God gave Adam and Eve a paradise and provided all they needed to eat and drink. In the desert, after fleeing Egypt, Yahweh fed the people on manna to satisfy their hunger and gave them water from the rock when they were thirsty. He furnished the prophets with food in times of need. God has always known the needs of His people and responded to them. Saint Augustine tells us that what our hearts ultimately hunger for is God. Thus, God must give us Himself to eat to satisfy our hunger.

This is indeed just what we believe, as we profess that Jesus is the bread of life and the cup of eternal blessing. The famous words of Jesus in today's Gospel, "Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life," are difficult to comprehend with human understanding. For the people of His time, with the Jewish dietary restrictions prohibiting the consumption of blood and raw meat, the concept was intolerable. At the Last Supper He gave His apostles, and us by extension, His body to eat and His blood to drink for our salvation. At each Mass the action of Jesus is revisited and made new on the altar.

Of all the miracles Jesus performs in the world, none is more marvelous or necessary than this – that He comes to us genuinely in the Eucharist. The elements we receive may still look and taste like bread and wine, but they have become His body and blood. And when we share in this great mystery, we may continue to look and feel the same way as before we participated in this sacred meal; however, we have been transformed into the body of Christ, the Church. Because of the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist, His true presence resides in us. We are no longer simply creatures of earth, but saved, and creatures of heaven. The mystery of the presence of Christ in the Eucharist is only comprehensible through faith. To paraphrase Franz Werfels from "The Song of Bernadette," to the one who has faith no proof is necessary, to the one without faith no proof is sufficient.

Many people believe only what they can see and have proved to them. The Eucharist is a means by which God cares for and loves us. You cannot prove love or caring, but you can experience them. Open your hearts and your minds, and you will feel and experience.

On Your Mark - Ready - Set - Go!!!

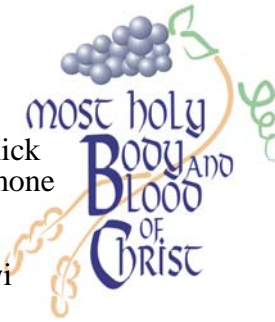
As you move through the summer months, you might pause to test your spiritual, evangelizing energy in a worthwhile endeavor.

In the thirteenth century, a Belgian nun by the name of Juliana had a vision: she saw the full moon silvery and radiant except for one dark spot. The meaning of the vision was revealed to her: the moon was the Church's liturgical year, the dark spot a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Today's feast of *Corpus Christi*—the Most Holy Body and Blood of

Christ—grew from Juliana's vision.

On this feast, many parishes observe the traditional *Corpus Christi* procession, giving honor to the Eucharist by carrying this greatest treasure out of the safety of our churches and into our streets. At the end of every Mass we are not just let out, we are sent forth, strengthened by the Eucharist, to be the Body of Christ in the world. The *Corpus Christi* procession is the dismissal writ large! We take Jesus with us, not only in our hearts, but carried in our midst and exposed in a monstrance. It is a public profession of faith and a blessing of the world. Jesus walks with us on these streets that we walk day after day, among those who know Him but yearn to know Him better, and among those who do not know Him. The Eucharist is a mystery to be believed, to be celebrated—and to be lived.

AROUND the ARCHDIOCESE of PHILADELPHIA

This week our diocese takes up the **Peter's Pence Collection**, which provides the Holy Father with the funds he needs to carry out his most important charitable works. The proceeds benefit the most disadvantaged: victims of war, oppression, and natural disasters. Through your generosity, we can cast the peace of Christ upon the world.

THE EUCHARIST UNIFIES THE CHURCH

"All who feed on the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist are brought together in unity by the Holy Spirit to form God's one holy people," Benedict XVI affirmed.

"Each of us who belong to the Church needs to leave the closed world of his individuality and accept the 'companionship' of others who break bread with us," he said. "We must think not in terms of 'me' but 'we'."

"Breaking down the barriers between us and our neighbors is the first prerequisite for entering the divine life to which we are called," the Pope said.

He continued, "We need to be liberated from all that imprisons us and isolates us: fear and mistrust towards others, greed and selfishness, unwillingness to run the risk of vulnerability to which we expose ourselves when we are open to love."

"Christ is alive in us, His body, the Church, His priestly people," the Pontiff acknowledged. "By feeding on Him in the Eucharist and receiving the Holy Spirit in our hearts we truly become the Body of Christ that we receive, we are truly in communion with Him and with each other, and we truly become instruments, in witness to Him before the world."

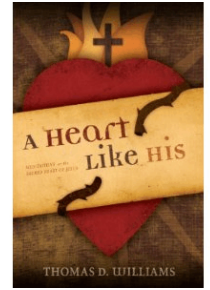

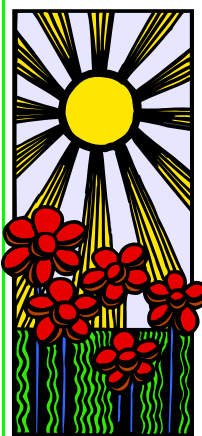
Our campaign has now exceeded \$12,000 in collections - 80% of our goal! This includes donations made by members of other Knights of Columbus Councils in our region to this initiative.

SCRIP SUMMER HOURS The summer schedule begins this week. The office is open every **Tuesday** throughout the entire summer, from 9AM- 12:30PM.

You can come into the office to purchase SCRIP or you can call me to place an order over the phone. These "pre-orders" are set aside in an envelope with your name on it and I can leave them either at the Parish Business Office for pick-up on any weekday from 9AM to 12:30PM, 1:30PM to 5PM or at the Parish House for pick-up on Sunday morning from 9AM to 12:30PM.

The SCRIP program consists of many different "gift cards/certificates" that Corpus Christi is able to purchase at a discount. The SCRIP office sells them to you at face value, so you are not paying any more money than you would be paying at the store. You will have an account set up in our computer system that records your purchases and accumulates a credit for you to use for tuition or REC fees at **ANY Catholic grade school, high school or college at ANY time.**

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, parents are requested to pre-register for the session by contacting the Parish Center Office 215-855-1311. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), at 7:30 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: **July 18th, August 15th and September 19th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.** Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

Baptism is administered at **1:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.**
