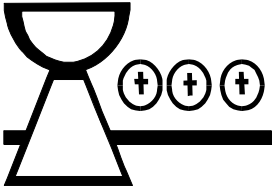

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

It is common in our Western culture to pursue the so-called “good life”. Being a participant in the “good life” means economic success, a secure job, the ability to have all possible creature comforts in this world, and to be worry free. Society dubs that situation the “good life”. Today, on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, Jesus invites us to celebrate the full life. The “full life” has a distinctly different set of concerns from the “good life”.

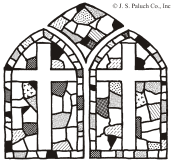

Jesus always sees the cross of Good Friday in the same vision with the glory of Easter Sunday. In this vision we find the full life. The “good life” is loaded with ease and comfort. The “full life” is a call to risk, challenge, endurance, obedience, and fulfillment. These two approaches to life are different indeed.

In today’s second reading, from the first letter of Peter, we find nourishment in God’s word for excelling in the pursuit of the “full life”. If you suffer for doing what is right, this is acceptable in God’s eyes. It was for this that you were called, since Christ suffered for you in just this way and left you an example, so you can follow in His footsteps. In these words we find the substance of the “full life”. The risen Jesus calls us to eliminate injustice, to cure disease, to do away with hunger, to make the poor wealthy, and to overcome fear in the dark valley with God’s love. The “full life” is loaded with challenge and risk. The “full life” calls us to care for the entire flock, while the “good life” offers us only the care of oneself.

The Resurrection of Jesus is a community event. In this event we were given the “full life” as Peter proclaims: “By His wounds, you were healed” – healed especially from the sins of the “good life,” and liberated from our selfishness into living the “full life” for the good of all.

This “full life” really consists in our development of intimacy with Jesus Christ. We become the body of Christ, as Paul calls us. Jesus bore our sins to the victory of the cross, because of His intense union with each of us – His call to the “full life”. Jesus is the gate to the pasture of “life to the full”.

Gospel, John 10:1-10 Christ uses the beautiful image of the shepherd to describe His care for His sheep. He also says he is the sheepgate and promises that "Whoever enters through Me will be safe."



"On the day of Pentecost, Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and addressed them: 'Let the whole house of Israel know beyond any doubt that God has made both Lord and Messiah this Jesus whom you crucified.' When they heard this, they were deeply shaken. They asked Peter and the other apostles, 'What are we to do brothers?' Peter answered: 'You must reform and be baptized, each of you, in the name of Jesus Christ... then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.'"

How many sermons have you listened to? How many, or few, allowed you to be 'shaken'? The fresh gift of the Spirit on Pentecost moved Peter to speak clearly, firmly with an enthusiasm no one could stop. That was because it was Pentecost.

The same Spirit is present in our church today. The message of the successor of Jesus is taught again by Benedict, or the one who preached in church today. Jesus is both Lord and Messiah. On this 'Good Shepherd' weekend, let's return to Peter challenging his listeners who then asked what they should do.

The Lord is calling others to shepherd His people. Maybe one listener, or person reading this, might hear the invitation to serve as a religious brother or sister, or priest. Another, maybe looking for a career change would consider such a call. Perhaps a retiree, or couple, might dedicate some time as lay volunteers with a missionary group, or even in a needy parish.

All of us can encourage others to follow Christ's call. How few persons there are who will be as bold as Peter and the apostles, though we all already enjoy the same Spirit. As the psalm says: 'Oh that today you would listen to His voice.' Finally may we pray that the Lord will raise from among us, others to shepherd His people.

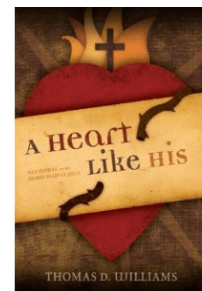

Renewing Our Commitment to Victim Assistance, Child Protection, and Priestly Integrity

Bulletin No. 2

May 2011

Introduction:

This is the second in a series of periodic bulletin inserts developed by the Archdiocese of Philadelphia to provide information to parishioners. Each bulletin insert will focus on action steps the Archdiocese has taken to assist victims, advance the protection of children, and ensure the integrity of the Priesthood.

Information about the *Standards of Ministerial Behavior and Boundaries*:

- The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops “**Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People,**” approved in June 2003 and revised in June 2005, is intended to create a secure environment for young people throughout the Church in the United States.
- Article 6 of the Charter states, “There are to be clear and well-publicized diocesan/eparchial standards of ministerial behavior and appropriate boundaries for clergy and for any other paid personnel and volunteers of the Church in positions of trust who have regular contact with children and young people.”
- Following the Charter, the Archdiocese of Philadelphia adopted its own Standards of Ministerial Behavior and Boundaries on May 5, 2003. (<http://bit.ly/AOPministerialstandards>)
- The Standards provide a clear guideline for acceptable behavior with young people.
- They make us all alert to possible inappropriate behavior by adults and provide direction for reporting concerns.
- The Standards cover: Conduct for Pastoral Counselors, Confidentiality, Conduct with Children, Harassment and Reporting Misconduct.
- Some examples of actions that would be considered violations of the Standards include: using foul language with a child, driving a child home alone after a practice, hugging and kissing a child, meeting with a child at a location other than a church or school alone, engaging in a parish or school sanctioned activity without at least one other adult.
- As part of the Safe Environment Training program mandated by the Archdiocese all priests, deacons, staff and volunteers who come into contact with children must read the Standards of Ministerial Behavior and Boundaries, acknowledge understanding of the contents and sign a pledge to abide by the Standards.
- By observing this code of conduct, adult leaders, whether clergy, coaches, teachers, staff or volunteers, serve as role models for the children they work with and show how adults should relate to young people.
- Any Church personnel or volunteers who violate the Standards may be removed or suspended from their position depending upon the nature of the offense.

Information About an Update to the Standards:

The Information and Communication Technology Addendum

- The Archdiocese realizes Church personnel and volunteers must effectively use digital means of communicating as part of their mission to spread the Good News of the Gospel in their work with young people.
- It also recognizes that part of its commitment to children and young people includes updating current policies to govern interaction in the rapidly changing electronic communication environment.

- In July 2011, an Addendum (or update) to the *Standards of Ministerial Behavior and Boundaries* will take effect. The Addendum covers Information and Communication Technology.
- The full text of the Addendum can be found at (<http://bit.ly/AOPstandardstechaddendum>).
- It provides guidance regarding appropriate interaction with minors through social networks, text messaging, e-mail, websites, video chatting, videos, photographs, blogs, and micro-blogs.
- It affirms the Archdiocesan directive that *all* communications with minors must be faithful to the teachings and values of the Catholic Church.
- The Technology and Communication Addendum states that the permission of the parent or guardian must be obtained in writing in order for an adult leader to communicate with minors via telephone, cell phone, text messaging, e-mail, social networks, or any other electronic means.
- It also provides clear guidance for acceptable interaction by adults with minors via digital means.
- Adults serving children and young people must always relate to them in ways that respect their physical, psychological, and emotional boundaries. In this regard, there is no difference between in person and digital interaction.
- Some examples of actions that would be considered violations of the addendum include: texting a child regarding a personal matter, allowing children to have access to personal postings on social media networks, setting up a youth ministry related website without permission, posting pictures of children on a youth group related website or related Facebook page without written permission from a parent or guardian.
- In keeping with the general purpose of the Standards, this addendum can alert us all to inappropriate behavior by adults and allows for a greater degree of accountability.
- The Archdiocese will provide online training for this addendum to the *Standards of Ministerial Behavior and Boundaries* for all clergy, lay employees and volunteers who work with young people.
- Any Church personnel and volunteers who violate the Addendum on Technology may be removed or suspended from their position depending upon the nature of the offense.

Implementation and Online Training:

- The Technology and Communication Addendum to the Standards of Ministerial Behavior takes effect July 1, 2011.
- Between May 1, 2011 and June 30, 2011, all clergy, lay employees, and volunteers who are in service to youth are required to complete a 15 minute online training concerning this addendum administered by the Archdiocesan Office for Child and Youth Protection.
- The information in this bulletin is being provided to parishes, schools and Archdiocesan institutions regarding the implementation and online training (www.aoptraining.org), which is mandatory.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required* to **pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office 215-855-1311**. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the **RE Room (in the church), at 7:30 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: May 16th, June 20th and July 18th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - received First Holy Communion - and *actively* practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.**

Certificates of eligibility *must have a parish seal* and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

Baptism is administered at 1:30PM EVERY SUNDAY.
